Olsen Cruise Lines' Public Relations Manager.

Welcome drinks and canapés were served in the stunning Observatory Lounge, with its panoramic views of Fort William, followed by an exchange of commemorative gifts. Guests also enjoyed the entertainment that had kindly been arranged in the town, which included a Craft Fayre, a fascinating 'Fort William Then and Now' talk by historian Ian Abernethy, held in the West End Hotel, and an insightful 'Wildlife in the Geopark' talk by David Findlay OBE, in the Lochaber Geopark Visitor Centre.

Lochaber Community Wind Band also entertained guests with a variety of tunes in Cameron Square, which was followed by the Lochaber branch of the Royal Scottish Country Dance Club performing a dancing demonstration, and pipers on the quayside to see off guests on the last of the tender boats...many armed with shopping bags, having taken advantage of the attractive retail offer within the town.

Sarah Kennedy, Company Secretary of Fort William Marina & Shoreline Company, said:

"It was a very successful visit by both Kate Forbes MSP and *Black Watch* and great memories were made by all involved in the event.

"The feedback from the passengers was that the town was clean and tidy and they enjoyed the entertainment and wonderful welcome that they received on shore. There were plenty of shopping bags going back on board and going round the town there was positive feedback from all the retailers and, despite the weather, a number reported an increase in takings of 5-10%, with one shop reporting a 15% increase!

"We are delighted that it went so well and we look forward to welcoming five cruise ships to Fort William in 2018 and anticipate this to increase significantly in 2019, with four bookings already received!"

The Fred. Olsen fleet has visited Fort William six times in 2017, from 10<sup>th</sup> May to 18<sup>th</sup> August, with three calls on *Boudicca* – sister ship to *Black Watch* – two on *Black Watch* and one on *Braemar*.

Black Watch will be returning to Fort William on 13<sup>th</sup> June 2018, on a seven-

night 'Lochs of Scotland' itinerary from Liverpool, and *Boudicca* on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2018, as part of a nine-night 'Lochs, Islands & the Military Tattoo' cruise from Dover.
