In order to watch the Sun become completely eclipsed by the Moon, you must be inside the narrow 'Path of Totality' – the track of the Moon's shadow on Earth. Typically, this elusive spot covers less than 1% of the Earth's

surface. Guests will also have the chance to witness that rarest of phenomena, the 'Solar Corona', when the Moon's apparent diameter is larger than the Sun, and creates a 'pearly white crown' around the Sun.

These three Spring sailings are all heading for the exact co-ordinates that will enable Fred. Olsen's ships to be in the best possible location to view this sensational event.

And if that was not enough, these cruises will also visit the Faroe Islands and a string of fascinating coastal towns and cities of Norway. A highlight will be the call into Tromsø during the time of the magical 'Northern Lights' – NASA scientists predict this to be the peak of an 11-year cycle for this spectacular natural light show, so there is a great chance to see a second wonder of nature!

There is so much to see and do, and guests can rest assured that their adventure ashore will be perfectly complemented by their time on board Fred. Olsen's smaller-sized, more intimate ships.

Boudicca will call at several attractive Norwegian ports: pretty, Art-Nouveau **Elesund**; **Tromsø**, inside the Arctic Circle, sometimes described as 'The Paris of the Arctic'; **Alta** (Finnmark), home for centuries to the Sami people and

their herds of reindeer; and **Leknes**, in the remote and beautiful Lofoten Islands.

Boudicca then spends a day at sea on 20th March 2015, en route to the Faroe Islands, Denmark, and is positioned at the best-suggested co-ordinates – 64.26.3N, 6.39.0W – for guests to make the most of viewing the extraordinary total eclipse of the Sun from the ship. The final port of call is **Runavik** on the Faroes, before *Boudicca* returns to **Southampton**.

Prices start from just £1,997 per person, based on two adults sharing an Inside, twin-bedded cabin (limited availability).

Braemar will be positioned off the coast of the Faroe Islands on 20th March 2015, when the longest duration of 'totality', of 2 minutes 47 seconds – the best opportunity to view the full solar eclipse – occurs. During its voyage, the cruise will also visit **Ålesund** (Norway), **Leknes** (Lofoten Islands, Norway), **Tromsø** (Norway) and **Runavik** (Faroe Islands), before returning to **Dover**.

Prices start from just £1,799 per person, based on two adults sharing an Inside, twin-bedded cabin (limited availability).

- Black Watch's 14-night W1502 'Solar Eclipse Cruise', ex Southampton on 16th March 2015

Black Watch will be positioned off the coast of the Faroe Islands on 20th March 2015, to give guests the very best chance of witnessing the total solar eclipse. The cruise will visit **Runavik** (Faroe Islands), **Leknes** (Lofoten Islands), **Tromsø**, **Alta**, **Trondheim** and **⊠lesund** (all Norway), before returning to **Southampton**.

Prices start from just £2,051 per person, based on two adults sharing an Inside, twin-bedded cabin (limited availability).

All prices include accommodation, all meals and entertainment on board, and port taxes. Guests can also upgrade to Fred. Olsen's 'all-inclusive' drinks package for just £29 per person per night.
