Fred. Olsen's ships visit four fantastic ports in Iceland. The capital city, Reykjavik, is a friendly, colourful network of small streets and historic buildings. Packed with museums, art galleries and theatres, there is also an abundance of natural wonders just outside the city. A tour to 'The Golden Circle' is highly recommended, as guests will explore Reykjavik's 'big three': Gullfoss – the 'Golden Waterfall', the Strokkur Geyser and Thingvellir National Park – a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Akureyri, which is in northern Iceland, was voted one of Lonely Planet's top ten recommended European travel destinations in 2013. Boasting a wealth of natural wonders that reflect the island's reputation for dramatic combinations of fire and ice, guests can take a tour to Godafoss Waterfall – meaning 'Waterfall of the Gods' – or go in search of Blue, Fin, Humpback and Minke Whales on one of the many boat excursions.

Facing magnificent Mount Holmatindur is Eskifjorður, Fred. Olsen's third port in Iceland. This town is peaceful, scenic and secluded and perfect for walking and exploring on foot. Guests can visit the local market and art gallery or relax in one of the welcoming cafés. The fourth port of call in Iceland is Ísafjörður. This town is perched on a dramatic sand spit, jutting out into an inlet on one of north-west Iceland's deepest fjords. Set against a backdrop of steep mountains, the town has some of the best-preserved timber buildings in Iceland and plenty of charming family-owned restaurants.

In addition to the interesting ports of call on board Fred. Olsen's Iceland cruises, guests will also experience some of the very best scenic cruising. Due to the smaller size of Fred. Olsen's ships guests, will be able to cruise deep into the fjords and inlets. - *Black Watch*'s 11-night W1408 'Puffins, Waterfalls & Geysers' cruise, ex Newcastle on 20th July 2014. *Prices start from £999 per person*.

This stunning cruise visits Reykjavik (Iceland) – for an overnight stay – Akureyri(Iceland) - for a second overnight stay – Eskifjorður (Iceland) and Runavik (Faroe Islands).
