

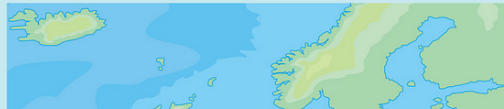

There are a variety of unique flower shows scattered throughout the magnificent estate, all of which are works of art and ready for guests to explore.

First stop on this ultimate city break cruise is Rouen (France), with a rich cultural heritage of museums and monuments. Here, guests can visit the statue marking the spot where Joan of Arc was burnt at the stake, or, with an overnight stay, may choose to venture further afield to Paris and explore this world-famous capital's many sights, including the Eiffel Tower, Arc de Triomphe and the Champs-Élysées.

Next stop is Amsterdam (Netherlands), where guests can visit Anne Frank's house to see the secret annex in which she and her family hid in from the Germans during the Second World War, and appreciate just how small it was. Other highlights of this fascinating city include canal cruises, Van Gogh's Museum, or a journey into the Dutch countryside to see windmills and Edam cheese being made.

The final overnight stay is in Hamburg (Germany), home to a wealth of cultural and architectural delights. Taking a city tour, guests will see the impressive ruins of St Nicolai Church, the Stock Exchange and St Peter's Church, before arriving at the City Hall, built in Neo Renaissance style. A very unique place to visit in the city is Miniature Wonderland - the world's biggest model railway and a true work of art.

Prices for this cruise start from just £720 per person, which is based on two adults sharing a twin, inside cabin, and include accommodation, all meals and entertainment, plus port dues.
